For 30 years, it's been our privilege to care for the community of Blackpool, Fylde and Wyre. Providing care, compassion and dignity and touching the lives of thousands of people across the Fylde coast.

Our dedicated team of staff and Volunteers are working towards a shared goal: that by 2020 everyone on the Fylde Coast should have access to good end of life care, in a place of their choosing.

Imagine the Fylde Coast without a hospice like Trinity. Imagine care at the end of your life without choice about where you were cared for or who was involved.

Choice is really important to anyone facing terminal illness, and our launch of a pilot overnight Hospice at Home service last September really underlines our determination to give people more options around their care. For some patients, staying at home is their final and greatest wish, and the support of our specially trained Trinity nurses will make it possible for more people to achieve it.

Trinity is a remarkable place: It is a place of happiness, hope and acts of astonishing kindness. It is not just a place of sadness. As a local charity, our care is provided free of charge, but we are not part of the NHS and face constant pressures around funding.

Demand for hospice care has never been higher, but we receive only limited money from central sources and must rely on the generosity of our local supporters to keep our doors open. Every year we see more and more patients and must raise over £5 million annually from voluntary donations.

It's the support of the local community that keeps Trinity open 24 hours a day, every day of the year.
