### 1. Welcome and apologies

## 3. Blue Skies Hospitals Fund

Kila Redfearn (Blue Skies) gave a presentation and showed a short film on the work of the fund, which is a charity set up to support Blackpool Teaching Hospitals. She outlined a number of forthcoming events and gave an insight into how the funds raised could help patients.

### 4. Enterprise Zone Update

Nick Gerrard (Blackpool Council) gave an update on the Blackpool Airport Enterprise Zone. He said that the newly-agreed masterplan set out a vision to make the EZ a premier business location in North West, creating thousands of new jobs over the next 25 years.

He said that the plans included the creation of new infrastructure on the site, including a spine road to address problems of accessibility.

One of the key objectives was to protect the future of the airport itself and a business plan for the airport will be produced by mid-year.

The overall EZ masterplan and associated delivery plan will be presented to the Lancashire Enterprise Partnership around May/June.

# 5. Water ReFILL Campaign

Emma Whitlock (Keep Britain Tidy Group/Love My Beach) presented on a campaign to reduce the number of plastic bottles left on streets and shorelines by promoting a water refill system.

She said that ReFILL Fylde Coast was a simple scheme whereby food-serving businesses agree to offer free tap water refills if people bring in their own bottles.

The aim is that if less plastic bottles are purchased, there are fewer dumped on the streets and beaches, a problem particularly pertinent to Blackpool during the busy summer months.

Emma said that there are currently 27 water refill stations on the Fylde Coast and, nationally, Costa Coffee have signed up to the scheme. The Blackpool Gazette is supporting the campaign to get more local businesses to sign up. ## 6. CultureBlackpool

Carolyn Primett (Blackpool Council) gave a presentation on a new campaign aimed at encouraging people to uncover the resort's culture and heritage offer.

CultureBlackpool has been developed as a partnership between VisitBlackpool, LeftCoast, the Winter Gardens, Grundy Art Gallery and Grand Theatre.

The campaign, which is being delivered under the banner of "The B-side At The Seaside", encourages both visitors and residents to explore the resort's rich architecture, heritage and internationally-acclaimed installations and events.

It is being supported by a range of ambassadors including the award-winning journalist John Robb, music star Little Boots (aka Victoria Hesketh) and artist Michael Trainor.

## 7. Big Sexy Bus

Julia Hutchings (Drugline) gave an overview of the services undertaken by the Lancashire-based Renaissance programme.

She said that the organisation had taken on an old shuttle bus and was planning to renovate it to offer a mobile unit offering sexual health and harm reduction services to communities and targeted events. Julia said it would also be used to support the night-time economy in Blackpool town centre.

Julia said that as a result of lottery funding they had already been able to undertake structural body repairs to the bus, including new flooring. However, a further £20k was required to complete the project.

She said that in addition to financial support, they were also looking for support in kind through provision of items such as PCs and TVs; interior fittings; driving tuition for staff; help with promotion and branding; volunteer drivers and bus running costs.

He said the Get Set Blackpool project was limited to 160 attendees, with the objective of getting around 40 of them to move on to become self-employed or start their own businesses.

He reported that Blackpool North Station will now re-open on Monday 16 April, three weeks later than originally planned.

He said that the first electric trains would arrive on Sunday 20 May from Liverpool and Monday 21 May from London Euston. An official launch/PR event was being planned at the station for the Monday to coincide with the arrival of the first London train.

More direct services are expected to be announced from September onwards.
