1. Welcome and apologies

Martin Long (chair) welcomed members and guests to the meeting. At the start of the meeting, a minute's silence was held as a mark of respect to Jimmy Armfield, who died a few days earlier.

2. Minutes of the last meeting/Matters arising

Minutes noted, no matters arising.

3. Playing Mercy Film Project

Matt Jones and Mac McMahon (Capture Films) gave a presentation on a new high-quality film drama they are seeking to make in Blackpool. The film, Playing Mercy, is based on a novel and is being planned with a budget of circa £1m.

They gave the group an insight into how the film might look and sound, as well as revealing some of the cast and production crew being lined up.

They said they had several potential investors lined up to support the film, but had opportunities for businesses to support either as investors or by providing services to help in the production of the film.

There was also an opportunity to use local talent to play some of the lead roles, particularly the teenage roles. Open castings would be held in the resort prior to the filming.

4. Blackpool's Piers

Carl Carrington (Blackpool Council) showed a film about the challenges facing Blackpool's Piers. He said that the piers had been placed on the World Monument Watch, alongside important heritage sites all over the world.

He said the main issue was the amount of money required to maintain piers given that many were in private ownership and owners were unable to access the sort of funds that might be available to local authorities. The latest survey had revealed that around £15m was required on repairs to North Pier alone.

Mr Carrington said that the Sedgwick family, who own Blackpool's three piers, were planning a Watch Day on June 9 with free activities throughout the day.

He said that Blackpool would also be hosting a major international conference in 2019 with owners of 89 piers across the world expected to attend.

5. Lancashire's Cathedral

The Dean of Blackburn Cathedral, Peter Howell-Jones gave a presentation on the development of the cathedral and emphasised its importance to the whole of Lancashire.

He set out four areas of activity: Interfaith relations and community cohesion; music outreach services across the county; education and learning; economic development and regeneration.

6. New For 2018

The group was given updates on four key investments in the visitor economy for 2018. Collectively, these investments are worth around £30m.

Hampton By Hilton

Paul Mathison (Create Construction) presented on the new 130-bedroom hotel under construction at South Beach and due to open around May time. He showed the group the proposed lay out and interior design of the hotel, all of which has been carried out to Hilton specifications with some additional Blackpool theming.

Project Elephant

Darren Webster (Blackpool Zoo) gave an update on Project Elephant, a capital investment which has come to fruition after four years of planning and development. He said the elephant facility, worth around £2.5m, was due to open at Easter with four elephants due to be relocated there from another UK zoo over the coming weeks. He extended an invitation to the group to view the facility after the next BBLG meeting on March 23.

Madame Tussauds

Kate Shane (Merlin Entertainments) gave an update on the various Merlin attractions in resort showing growth in visitor numbers and satisfaction ratings; new developments including details of two new features at the Madame Tussauds attraction – Marvel Comics superheroes and a Sporting Heroes Academy. Both will be housed in what is currently disused space in the building and are due to open at Easter.

Icon, Blackpool Pleasure Beach

Robert Owen (Blackpool Pleasure Beach) gave an update on the new ICON rollercoaster which is due to open in late spring. He showed the group two films, one showing the construction of the £16m ride, the other a simulation from a rider's viewpoint.

7. Electrification Update

Jonathan Cooke (Network Rail) and Peter Gerring (Northern Rail) gave an update on the Blackpool to Preston electrification project. It was noted that the Blackpool South line was due to open on schedule on the following Monday, with the Blackpool North line reopening on time on March 26.

However, it was also noted that there was a significant delay on the Preston-Bolton-Manchester corridor which would result in bus replacement services being put in place on more than 20 weekends between now and the summer.

Robert Owen (Pleasure Beach) and Kate Shane (Merlin) both expressed serious concern over the potential impact of this disruption on visitor numbers. It was agreed that a separate meeting would be held with Northern Rail to look at measures that might help mitigate.

CultureBlackpool

He reported that a new campaign had been launched at the Tower Circus earlier in the month, aimed at showcasing Blackpool's rich heritage assets. **Note**: A more detailed presentation on the CultureBlackpool campaign will be made at the March meeting of the BBLG.

Town Centre Improvement Programme

He drew the group's attention to the latest phase of town centre improvement works. He said that the Town Centre BID was planning a further meeting with Council representatives towards the end of February to discussing the ongoing works. He said that members of the BBLG would be welcome to attend that meeting if they wished to do so and he would circulate a time/date once the meeting was fixed.

9. Any Other Business
