1. Welcome and apologies

Martin Long (chair) welcomed members and guests to the meeting.

2. Minutes of the last meeting/Matters arising

Nothing to report.

3. Winter Gardens

Michael Williams (Managing Director, Winter Gardens) welcomed guests to the Baronial Hall. He showed a short film, showcasing the expansive programme of entertainment at the Winter Gardens as well as new investment including the conference and exhibition centre and refurbishment of the Spanish Hall. He advised BBLG members that they could collect two complimentary tickets for the October 2 evening performance of Kinky Boots at the Opera House by visiting the box office after the meeting.

4. Preparing For Brexit

Steve Thompson (Director of Resources, Blackpool Council) gave the group a brief insight into some of the issues that were likely to affect businesses in the event of a No-Deal Brexit at the end of October.

He highlighted a number of areas where there might be an implication for business including regulatory issues, employment, data handling, currency fluctuations, and partnership working.

He said that latest research suggested that 42 per cent of SMEs were still not prepared for a No-Deal Brexit.

Steve also highlighted a Chamber of Commerce Help For Brexit service in conjunction with the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy. This included a programme of activities throughout October including webinars, seminars, workshops, training courses and business clinics.

The Help For Brexit Service is free to all businesses operating in Blackpool, Fylde, Wyre, Preston, Lancaster, Chorley, South Ribble and West Lancashire.

5. CLVR Money

Ron Bell and Anthony Brookes gave the group an insight into CLVR Money, the credit union that serves Blackpool, Fylde, Wyre and Preston.

Ron said that it was originally established 10 years ago as the Blackpool, Fylde & Wyre Credit Union and had since grown incrementally to the point where it now had 5,000 local people as members and £5m in reserves.

He said it was a modern credit union, regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority, with attractive offices on Birley Street in Blackpool town centre and with most of its business transacted online.

Ron said it was established as a partnership with businesses and organisations including Blackpool Council, Blackpool & The Fylde College, UCLAN and Blackpool Teaching Hospitals, with employees electing to become members and saving through payroll deductions.

Those savings were, in turn, used to make loans to help borrowers in need avoid doorstep lenders. He said that approximately £2m in loans was put out to local people every 14 months.

Anthony added that the credit union was looking for more businesses to become payroll partners. He said the primary objective was to promote good financial management, build savings and offer affordable lending. He said it cost nothing for a business to become a payroll partner.

6. International Men's Day

Sue Littlefair (The Washington Group) and Paul Stewart (Save Association) gave a joint presentation on issues relating to mental health, particularly in relation to men.

They pointed out that most businesses would have people suffering from mental health-related issues within their workplace, but these were not always apparent. They highlighted Blackpool Transport Services as one local business that had devised a strategy for mental health and wellbeing for its workforce, a model which had subsequently been used in other areas.

Paul, a former Blackpool and England footballer, gave the group his personal insight into mental health.

Businesses were encouraged to sign up to an International Men's Day event which will be staged at Blackpool Football Club between 9.30am and 4pm on Tuesday 19 November. The event has been designed to raise awareness of mental health and wellbeing, and the prevalence of male suicide.

Attendees will be able to listen to real life stories, attend interactive workshops, visit a marketplace of community support organisations, and sign up to the Time To Change campaign.

7. Pride Of Place Partnership

Paul Smith (Special Projects Director, Pride Of Place Partnership) and Steve Fogg (chair of Lancashire Enterprise Partnership and board member of Blackpool Pride Of Place) gave a joint presentation on the work being undertaken in Blackpool.

Paul gave the group an insight into the make-up of the partnership and reported on the lobbying work that was being undertaken to ensure that Blackpool got a better deal from central Government. He said there were various initiatives underway relating to inward investment and improved infrastructure.

Steve told of the importance of employers engaging with young people to drive up ambition in local schools He said that there would be a special breakfast event organised by the Fylde Coast Responsible Business Network at Blackpool Football Club on October 17. David Slater (Blackpool Council Business Support Team) gave the group an insight into the programme for this year's Blackpool Enterprise Week, which is being staged from November 18-22 and includes workshops and events for start-ups and young businesses.

9. The Blackpool Colour Palette

Tina Redford, artistic director for LeftCoast, presented on an innovative "Painting The Town" initiative which had been developed in association with Johnstone's Paints.

She said this had resulted in the creation of a palette of 10 paint colours inspired by Blackpool residents' stories. It was intended that the range of paints form part of a place-making campaign for businesses and organisations to come together to improve the built environment.

It would also support the arts in the town as every tin sold would give a contribution to new art programmes.

Tina said that the first working partnership had been established with Blackpool Pleasure Beach, which involved use of the colour palette on the buildings on Ocean Boulevard. These would be unveiled at a special launch event at the White Tower building on October 3, to which all businesses were welcome to attend.
