Business Impact

- Cybercrime costs the UK 27 billion pounds a year
- According to UK's Federation of Small Businesses (FSB) **54% of small businesses** said they had been a **victim of cyber crime** in the last 12 months
- According to FSB, the **average cost** to a small business is **£800** but this can be as much as £5,000 per attack. For larger businesses it can increase to hundreds of thousands of pounds

29% of businesses have **lost a client** because of Cyber crime



It isn't just the financial cost ...

- Cost of **not being able to operate** your business/down time
- **Reputational** damage

A study from Software Advice earlier this year found that **44% of SMEs** have **not trained** their team on cybersecurity **since 2020**, despite **62% of them experiencing an increase** in cyber attacks in the same period.
