What is an Enterprise Adviser?

Enterprise Advisers are experienced people who may be employed, self-employed or retired, who volunteer to work closely with a specific school or college to motivate and support young people in their career aspirations.

As an Enterprise Adviser you will:

- share a passion to ensure all our young people are provided with and can be the best they can be.
- support and work with an individual school or college, and their senior leadership teams in shaping the schools' career strategy, enterprise and employer engagement.
- provide an external voice and be the schools' critical and supportive adviser.
- be fully supported by a team of full time Enterprise Coordinators who will provide you with a full induction, training and match you with a local school or college.
